Existing initiatives & EU requirements

- Feasibility study for the "Balkans Digital Highway Initiative" (World Bank Group);
- "North Balkans Next Generation Access Network" (NOBAL NGA Network) Project;
- Directive 2014/61/EU requires measures to be realised reducing the cost of deploying high-speed ECNs and synergies should be sought between ENE, TRA, Telecom and other sectors, by reusing existing infrastructure.





Discussion points

(1) Should WBIF consider Digital Infrastructure as additional eligible sector?

(2) Assistance could be provided (for example) in:

a. analysing broadband needs and gaps (both for digital service infrastructures and broadband networks); and / or

b. supporting the roll-out of broadband networks, especially in remote and less populated areas through TA to prepare relevant projects in an efficient and timely manner.
